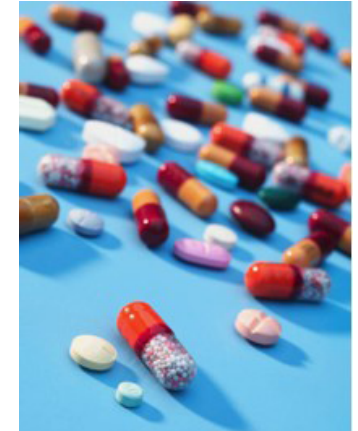
About The Presenters

Mary Kay O'Sullivan, MA, LMFT, LADC, LPC is a licensed marriage & Family Therapist, Drug & Alcohol Counselor and a Licensed as a Professional Counselor. She has served as the Director of The Center, a behavioral health and addictions training organization with a student base of over 5000, after serving as senior trainer at The Center for over 8 years. In addition, she has been a clinician and administrator in the substance abuse and dual diagnosis fields for over 17 years and has worked with populations ranging from adolescents and the chronically mentally ill to criminal justice clients. Ms. O'Sullivan provides consultation regionally and nationally in the specialty areas of criminal justice treatment and rehabilitation, co-occurring disorders, women's issues in treatment and program design. Ms. O'Sullivan has been the director of inpatient, outpatient, and partial hospitalization programs for both adults and adolescents with behavioral health and addictive disorders.

Dr. Marcella Sorg is a forensic and medical anthropologist who has worked in substance abuse related consulting and research since 1980. Since 2002 she has focused on the epidemiology of drug-induced deaths, particularly in rural populations. She is currently the Director of the Rural Drug and Alcohol Research Program at the Margaret Chase Smith Policy Center, University of Maine, as well as a regular guest researcher with the Community Epidemiology Work Group, National Institute on Drug Abuse. Dr. Sorg works closely with the medical examiner community in the study of poisoning deaths.

Workshop Overview

Dr. Sorg will provide an overview of the trends in Maine's drug related overdose deaths up through 2007, including the roles of the drugs involved, and their combinations. She will also discuss how these deaths are investigated, the role of the medical examiner, and implications for prevention.

Mary Kay O'Sullivan will be presenting information on current trends in street drugs. Designer drugs, such as Ice, Oxycontin, Ecstasy, Ketamine, DXM, GHB, and other synthetics for a variety of reasons, are becoming an epidemic in the United States. Many people are unaware of their use because they can be sold under traditional trade names that disguise their origin. This course will focus upon providing the information necessary for people in the community to understand and appropriately address the current changes in drug use. Special attention will be given to the composition, effects, and ramifications of the use of these chemical derivatives. Issues of particular interest will include availability, economic accessibility, and legal issues that promote their use to potentially epidemic proportions.

Learning Objectives

Participants will be able to:

1. Describe current trends and implications in Maine's drug overdose deaths.
2. Describe basic composition of the most prevalently used synthetic & designer drugs;
3. Define the major effects of each of these substances;
4. Describe the dynamics that create the demand for these drugs; and
5. Review intervention methods and techniques for use with people currently using these substances.

Target Audience

The target audience for this training is Law Enforcement, EMS, Health Care Providers, Substance Abuse Treatment Providers, Community Coalition Professionals, Substance Abuse Prevention and Health Promotion Practitioners, State Agency Prevention Staff, School Health Coordinators and School Nurses, Local Health Officers, and others who deliver substance abuse prevention services or who are interested in substance abuse prevention.
